#### ARTIST STATEMENT

Kelly Carámbula is a San Francisco-based artist and sculptor. Her work explores elements of control (and lack thereof), freedom, and imperfection, often incorporating surprises that encourage the viewer to look closer, longer, or from a different perspective. She is continually interested and inspired by her children's artwork, the relationships between color, form, and texture, and the way nature hands us small surprises if we take the time to look.

#### CONVERGE

JANUARY 2021 | PINHOLE COFFEE

After nearly a year without new art, I was commissioned to create a large-scale piece of art to welcome customers back. The result is "converge", a collection of experiments, including some from the early days of quarantine, that come together to make large-scale collage that is full of life and energy.

#### SOLO SHOWS

#### **MOVING PAST**

JUNE 2022 | ELEANOR HARWOOD GALLERY

In her show, Moving Past, Carámbula confronts what it's meant and felt like to live through a pandemic with two small children, one of whom has special needs. Sometimes we suppress feelings and emotions just to get through difficult moments. What happens when we go back, acknowledge deep feelings, and set them free? We get to move the past out of our bodies and move beyond. And then we can see the beauty in our pain.

#### **BALANCING ACT**

APRIL 2022 | LEGION PROJECTS

For the past year, Carámbula has been exploring themes around traditional "women's crafts"—sewing, quilting, and weaving—and how those things keep us safe, warm, and comfortable. These practices have allowed women to express themselves artistically in ways that weren't always achievable in the art world. In the same light, she has been exploring contradictions between materials as a way to express the dichotomies of motherhood and the balance of mothering two very different children.

#### PUSH

AUGUST 2019 | PINHOLE COFFEE

Push explored what happened when I pushed past fear—pushed further. When I questioned myself and my work and attempted to answer these questions even if it seemed like I might fail. The resulting installation showed the results of my internal critiques.

### A YEAR OF COLOR AND FORM

SEPTEMBER 2018 | RARE DEVICE

The process and product of a year spent rediscovering creativity through two simple ideas: color & form. Artist Kelly Carámbula spent a year exploring these ideas across media including paper, clay, wood, and metal. The result is a show— and a practice—demonstrating that these basic concepts have no end.
